# **Synthesis**

## **Meaning:**

"Synthesis" means **joining two or more simple sentences into one** sentence without changing the meaning.

In Hindi: Synthesis का अर्थ है – दो या दो से अधिक साधारण वाक्यों को मिलाकर एक वाक्य बनाना।

This is the opposite of **Analysis** (breaking one sentence into two).

In exams, you are asked to combine sentences using correct grammar.

# **★** Types of Synthesis

# 1. Using Clauses

A **clause** is part of a sentence having a subject and verb.

Clauses are of three main types:

## (a) Noun Clause

## Used as subject / object.

- Simple: I do not know this fact. He is honest.
- Combined: I do not know that he is honest.

#### **Examples:**

- 1. I hope that he will pass.
- 2. She said that she was tired.
- 3. He told me that he was busy.

#### (b) Adjective Clause

Qualifies a noun (acts like an adjective).

- Simple: This is the boy. He won the prize.
- Combined: This is the boy who won the prize.

## Examples:

- 1. This is the house which my father built.
- 2. I know the man who is singing.
- 3. The book that you gave me is interesting.

### (c) Adverb Clause

Tells time, reason, condition, place, etc.

- Simple: He worked hard. He might pass.
- Combined: He worked hard so that he might pass.

#### **Examples:**

- 1. I shall wait till you come.
- 2. He ran because he was afraid.
- 3. If you work hard, you will succeed.

## 2. Using Phrases

A **phrase** has no subject + verb, but can shorten sentences.

- Simple: He is a man. He is of great wealth.
- Combined: He is a man **of great** wealth.

## Examples:

- 1. The girl with blue eyes is my sister.
- 2. He lived in a house made of wood.
- 3. The boy in the red shirt is my friend.

# 3. Using Participles

Participle = Verb + ing / ed form used as adjective.

- Simple: He saw a snake. He ran away.
- Combined: Seeing a snake, he ran away.

## Examples:

- 1. Hearing the noise, the baby woke up.
- 2. The sun having set, we returned home.
- 3. Walking on the road, I met an old friend.

## 4. Using Infinitives

Infinitive = "to + verb".

- Simple: He went to the market. He bought vegetables.
- Combined: He went to the market to buy vegetables.

#### Examples:

- 1. She works hard to pass.
- 2. He came here to meet me.
- 3. The soldiers fought to save the country.

# **5. Using Conjunctions**

Join sentences with and, but, or, so, because, although, etc.

- Simple: He is poor. He is honest.
- Combined: He is poor **but** honest.

#### Examples:

- 1. I was ill, so I could not attend school.
- 2. Ram is rich and generous.
- 3. Work hard or you will fail.

# *⊗* Examples of Synthesis

- He is rich. He is unhappy.
   Though he is rich, he is unhappy.
- 2. The sun set. We returned home.

  (3) We returned home after the sun had set.
- 3. I saw a bird. The bird was flying. (\*\*) I saw a bird which was flying.
- 4. He failed. He worked hard.
  - (3) He failed though he worked hard.
- 5. He finished his work. He went out.
  After finishing his work, he went out
- 6. He saw the lion. He ran away.
  - → On seeing the lion, he ran away.
- 7. The sun set. The soldiers returned.
   → The soldiers returned after the sun set.
- 8. He made a mistake. He was punished.
  - → He was punished because he made a mistake.
- 9. I know the man. He is a doctor.
  - → I know the man who is a doctor.
- 10. She sings well. She also dances well.
  - → She sings well and dances well.
- 11. The boy is very intelligent. He won the prize.
  - → The boy, being intelligent, won the prize.
- 12. He went to the station. He received his uncle.
  - → He went to the station to receive his uncle.
- 13. The teacher punished him. He was very lazy.
  - → The teacher punished him because he was very lazy.
- 14. This is the book. You gave me this.
  - → This is the book which you gave me.
- 15. He worked hard. He failed.
  - → He worked hard but he failed.
